MESSAGE FROM ROGER

Dear Friends.

A few weeks ago, Mary Clare, our thirteen-year-old, announced one evening, "I feel like stargazing." It was a chilly evening, but it was also one of those crystal-clear winter nights: cold with low humidity. Jupiter and Venus were flirting in the southeastern sky. It was a great night to study the heavens. She bundled up, tucked a pillow under her arm, grabbed the blue plaid comforter that rests by the front door for just such occasions, and headed out.

When she came back in a little later, she didn't have much to say. Later that night, when I was tucking her in, she said, "Dad, here's the thing about looking at the stars: It makes you realize how tiny you really are."

I thought of the 14th Century English mystic Julian of Norwich. God gave her visions, and in one vision, she wrote, "God showed me a little thing, in the palm of my hand, round like a ball, no bigger than a hazelnut." As she puzzled over what this could be, God told her, "It is all of creation." She couldn't believe how insignificant it was, and she marveled that it didn't disintegrate, collapsing into nothingness. Then God spoke to her again: "It lasts, both now and forever, because I cherish it." All that is, tiny, and sustained by God's love.

The season of Lent is an opportunity for sustained self-examination and confession. But I worry that when we hear the word "confession" we think it means admitting to God how bad we've been and unworthy we are, that the word encourages us to cultivate what the German theologian Wolfhart Pannenberg called "Protestant guilt-consciousness piety."

But *sin* is not the primary content of our confession. *Truth* is. And there is much truth worthy of confession. My daughter made a confession the other night: We are tiny, insignificant. That is true. Julian of Norwich made a confession: We are loved and sustained by God. Also true. Saint Paul made a confession when he wrote that "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Equally true (but not *more* true). Psalm 8 makes a startling confession, beginning where Mary Clare began, with our relative insignificance: "When I look at your heavens . . . the moon and the stars [I ask] what are human beings that you are mindful of them?" But the writer knows the answer: "You have . . . crowned them with glory and honor" (vv. 3-5). True—all of it.

We confess more than our sin. We confess the complex, complicated truth of what it means to be human. Tiny. Loved. Cherished. Confused. Glorious. Sinful. Redeemed. It would be a mistake to obsess over one of these qualities at the expense of the others.

When I look at the heavens, I agree with the psalmist and my daughter—we are but a speck, here one instant, gone the next. When I confess my sin, I acknowledge that as a speck, I try to create a life of significance on my own terms. When I experience God in prayer, I confess my gratitude that God's loving care sustains this speck of a life, that I'm cherished beyond measure—as all of us are. Perhaps the truest truth of them all.
