As we enter the month of February, today's music recognizes Black History Month. The organ prelude and postlude are taken from a suite of four movements based upon familiar Afro-American hymns and spirituals. The opening hymn is an African American spiritual based on the imagery of "the race that is set before us" in Hebrews 12:1-2. At the 11:00 am service the benediction response is another such spiritual depicting a people bound in slavery but still singing about dedicating themselves to God's use. And the Offertory Anthem at 11:00 am is William L. Dawson's exuberant spiritual "Ain'-a That Good News," which promises the rewards in heaven for a people enslaved on earth.
