Highlights MAR 10 2024 Spring Forward

Dear Friends,

I grew up in Indiana, where we didn't observe daylight saving time, in part because the rural portions of Indiana felt it wasn't "good for the cows." Even though I've now lived for twenty-five years in places that "spring forward" in March, it still feels jolting to wake again in the dark for the purpose of an hour of additional sunlight in the evening. It's as if we are trying to force into one day, through a sleight of hand, the work of a whole season: the lengthening of the days.

In the Christian calendar we are in the season of Lent, a penitential season, given to us for contemplating our sinfulness and meditating on our mortality. The most downer season in the church year. As with many other churches, we don't sing hymns with the word "Alleluia" during Lent.

Last week I heard an interview on the local classical music station with a church musician who was celebrating the fact that Lent allows him to pull out all the minor-key, solemn-mood music—"dolorous," I believe, was a word he used—that he typically avoids in more joyous liturgical seasons. After all, Lent begins with the ritual smearing of ashes on the forehead, accompanied by the reminder, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

But today, I'm feeling contrarian.

There are a couple of things that make me want to temper this Lenten mood. First, the word "Lent" come from an old English word that means "to lengthen," and it refers to spring, the season during which the days get longer. Even in Indiana, the sun shines later into the evening. It's a fact of life in the Northern Hemisphere: March means longer days and more light thank goodness. Spring has an irrepressible hopefulness about it. If Lent is such a downer, why was it named after spring?

Second: Lent is a season of forty days, *not including Sundays*. There are actually forty-six days between Ash Wednesday and Easter (I just opened the calendar app on my phone to confirm this). Sundays don't count because every Sunday is a little Easter. Christians gather for worship on Sunday, the first day of the week, rather than Saturday, the Jewish Sabbath and the day



on which God rested according to Genesis, because Jesus was raised from the dead on the first day of the week. Every Sunday is a celebration of the Resurrection, even Sundays in Lent.

So, as the days inch longer, I trust you will continue to fast and pray, remember your mortality and practice self-examination. I trust you will give alms and confess your sins, all traditional Lenten practices. But I invite you to do it with a spring in your step. And when you see the forsythia pop and the daffodils bloom, when you hear the spring peepers chirping their mating call on a walk in the orange sunlight of late evening, remember that resurrection is a present reality; that Christ's new life is here, now; and that the light of God's glory shines whatever the season.

All facts that makes me want to whisper an illicit "Alleluia!"


