For the past seven years, Cheryl has served several churches in the Pittsburgh area, walking with congregations through seasons of transition and renewal.

Cheryl and her family live in Stanton Heights with their two daughters, Issy (10) and Indi (6), and a small flock of chickens. She finds joy in building community rooted in trust and creativity. Cheryl sees Fox Chapel as a place brimming with possibility and looks forward to serving alongside you—thoughtful, hopeful, and faithful people—as together you continue to discover what the Holy Spirit is doing in your midst.
