You Are A Beloved Child of God

Friends,


Last month, a dear friend's husband became one of many people to lose their tech job in the first quarter of 2024.

Right after my friend learned of her husband's layoff, she immediately started doing All. Of. The. Things. She pulled her kiddo out of expensive summer camps. Made plans for a simpler Easter celebration. Cancelled her Book of the Month subscription. She helped her husband update his resume and apply for jobs.

After she did all the things, she realized the hard part of unemployment is not necessarily making painful lifestyle changes. It's learning to live with uncertainty. It's learning to live with the knowledge that what you've always done is no longer working, and that you have no idea what your next steps are.

Some of our friends have struggled to support her well in this season of uncertainty. They share stories of what they did when their husband lost his job. They send meals that her kid can't eat because he's allergic to gluten. They ask her every week if her husband has found a new job yet. She feels exhausted managing all of their offers to help.

To support her in this, I suggested that we read a book together that I found tremendously helpful during those early, scary days of the pandemic. The book is called *Wintering: The Power of Rest and Retreat in Difficult*



Times by Katherine May. The book begins with Katherine, a creative writing professor, unable to return to work after her husband's illness. When she finds herself stuck in the abyss of uncertainty, she wrote,

When I started to feel the drag of winter, I began to treat myself like a favored child: with kindness and love. I assumed my needs were reasonable and that my feelings were signals of something important. I kept myself well fed and made sure I was getting enough sleep. I took myself for walks in the fresh air and spent time doing things that soothed me. I asked myself: What is this winter all about? I asked myself what change is coming?

My friend and I are now in the habit of texting each other once a day, "How are you treating yourself like a favored

child today?" Some days the answers are silly – I listened to the Spice Girls at full volume on the way home from school drop off. Some days the answers are all we can do – I had oatmeal with raisins and brown sugar for dinner tonight, even though I have no appetite.

We've been doing this for about a month now, and I've learned a surprising lesson about pastoral care along the way. I've learned that many people are going about their days living with some degree of uncertainty. And they don't need advice. They don't need us to fix the uncertainty. They need us to sit with them and say, I see you in all your messiness, and I am here to walk alongside you and remind you that you are a beloved child of God. While winter won't last forever, I'm here to help you discover what this winter is all about.

Helping people discover what their personal winters are all about, sure sounds like pastoral care to me.

Elmarie serves as a regional liaison to Iraq, Syria, and Lebanon. She works to strengthen the relational ties between the churches in her region and churches in the United States. Scott serves with the Middle East Council of Churches (MECC) as a writer in residence. Scott has been asked by the MECC to lead their efforts in responding to children traumatized by unrest and war in Iraq and Syria who now seek refuge in Lebanon.


