A Letter from Sam Harding, Director of Christian Education and Youth Ministry

Steve Jobs once said "The people who are crazy enough to think they can change the world are the ones who do." Some people might be deterred by this statement. Deterred by thoughts such as "I don't want to be labeled as crazy," or "how can I change the world when it is just me trying to make a difference?" These thoughts can be scary, but that doesn't make them true. We have our own little world here at FCPC. A world that could benefit from some change and a few crazy ideas. Single moments, whether positive or negative, define our individual worlds every day. Moments such as the death of a loved one, receiving an unexpected gift, or spending a weekend at camp. For me, one of those world changing moments came in the form of a horseback riding accident while working at summer camp. There is always something, whether crazy or not, that can be done to change someone's world.

At the youth group's annual trip to Laurelville, PKF (Pittsburgh Kids Foundation) actually throw kids in the mud to teach them about Jesus. Now that's crazy! But it works! Youth leave camp with a life-changing experience knowing Jesus but are brought there by experiencing fun in the mud. It doesn't have to be mud. Start with something smaller, like giving a smile to a total stranger or telling a scared child that everything is going to be okay. These small moments can change the world of someone, without us even knowing it.

We as Christians are called to love one another. John 13: 34-35 states, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." As a lot of us know, love can be crazy, but love can change the world. FCPC, I challenge you this week to be a little crazy. Be a support for someone who needs it, sign up for a camp, show love in the world so others may see Jesus. Do whatever needs done in order to fulfill the "crazy" agenda. So, let's show love, and let's change the world!





World Communion Sunday

The underlying and all-encompassing oneness that is church flows from the underlying and all-encompassing oneness that is God. The oneness reverberates in the underlying and all-encompassing oneness that is the Christian calling, the Christian life. *Eugene Peterson*

Unity is a desire that we all have. We want to be united with our family and friends, and with our church. We long for oneness with God and with all creation. What can we, should we, do to make that unity a reality? However, maybe that is the wrong question. Is unity something we create and work for, or is it God's gift to us?

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. It was adopted by the Presbyterian Church in 1936 and by the Federal Council of Churches in 1940. Today close to 40 denominations around the world participate in this celebration. World Communion Sunday is a day that Christians focus on our oneness with God and with all God's people, Christians from all over the world.

The intent of World Communion Sunday is to remind the Church that through Jesus Christ we are united with God and with each other. Jesus is head of the church and he desires that his people be one (see Jesus' prayer in John 17:6-26, especially verses 11, 21-23). There are 40 denominations throughout the world that participate in World Communion Sunday, which makes me wonder how successful we are at celebrating our unity.


